PARIS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY
GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

(also see Special Class Rules)

EXHIBITOR FEE \$10.00-all exhibitors must pay an exhibitor fee (excluding juniors) to the Paris Agricultural Society for the current year. **If a Junior Exhibitor is entering an adult entry class that Junior must pay a exhibitor fee. One free admission pass for exhibitors only will be included and to be picked up with entry tags**

ENTRY FEE : Are in addition to an exhibitor fee for some classes, and are returned as prize money. Entry fee cost is listed in book for the following classes: Poultry, Rabbits, Hunter Horses, Youth Horse, Quarter Horse Show

20% entry fee is deducted from each exhibitor who has been awarded total cash prize money of \$5.00 or more from the following classes: Heavy Horse, Roadsters, Shetland & Fine Harness, Hackney, Sheep, Goat, Cattle

10% entry fee is deducted from each exhibitor who has been awarded total cash prize money of \$5.00 or more from the following classes: Grain, Corn & Hay, Wine, Fruits, Roots & Vegetables, Art, Crafts & Hobbies, Photography, Plants & Flowers, Dairy, Apiary & Domestic Science, Handi-Crafts, Clothing.

Note: 100% of above mentioned deductions are applied to the cost of administering prizes.

ENTRIES

1. DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES IS AUGUST 22 2011 except where noted. Make your entries early by mail to

Box 124, Paris N3L 3E7, fax (519) 442-5121, email info@pairfairgrounds.com, or in person at the Fair Office

NOTE: ENTRIES must be made early in order to be processed by the computer. We appreciate your cooperation in this regard.

2. ENTRY FORMS: All entries of articles and livestock for exhibition must be made on printed forms and received by the Office no later than Monday August 22 nd . Changes or additions to the original entry may be made at the office. Only one article per class/section is allowed, except where otherwise noted.

Note to Exhibitors: We do not encourage added entries, but will be pleased to allow late entries up to Monday afternoon, time permitting. Your participation is important!

2. ENTRY TAGS may be picked up at the Fair Office. **Each member will be given ONE FREE ADMISSION when entry tags are picked up.**

4. PLACE HALL ENTRIES ON WEDNESDAY August 31st , between the hours of 2:30 and 8:30 p.m. **EXCEPTION:** Amateur Winemaker Competition and livestock will be exhibited on days and times specified. Directors will be on hand to accept entries.

5. ALL ENTRIES must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor. In the case of every article, product, and chattel exhibited, the said article, product or chattel must be the actual production, growth or manufacture, as the case may be, of the person exhibiting same. The Directors of the Society shall discard all soiled or defaced work and instruct Judges to award prizes to new and up to date work.

6. REFUNDS: NO ENTRY FEE REFUND for scratches in Horse Shows unless a certificate from the Show Veterinarian is presented.

JUDGING

7. Only authorized directors allowed in the Halls while Judging is being done. Any exhibitor who interferes with judges while engaged in making their awards, either by conversation or under any pretense, will result in forfeiture of all prizes to which they might otherwise be entitled, and will be promptly excluded from competition. Decision of judges final; no appeal will be considered.

8. **AMATEUR WINEMAKERS COMPETITION** will be judged in the J.H. Buck Exhibition Centre **Friday, August 26th 2011 starting at 7 p.m.** Case display will be in Agri-Plex building. Each participant will pay regular exhibitor fee of \$10.00 each year plus additional charge of \$1.00 per bottle submitted for competition.

9. **PROTEST** may be made against irregularity or breach of rules by any exhibitor or interested party. A deposit of \$25.00 must accompany the written protest which will be retained by the Society if the protest is not sustained. The President and Vice-Presidents shall be a committee to decide on the protest, and their decision is final.

10. **EXHIBITS** shall be removed from Exhibit Building between 7 and 9 p.m. the last day of the Fair. Directors not responsible for any article left in the buildings after 9 p.m.

11. **ALL LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY shall be free of disease** and accompanied by a certificate of health or vaccination, if applicable. They are subject to inspection by the Show Veterinarian, who has power to remove exhibit from the grounds.

12. While the Directors will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to secure the safety of articles sent to the exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting. Should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen, the Directors will give all the assistance in their power toward the recovery, but will not make payment for the value thereof.

COMMERCIAL EXHIBITS AND CONCESSIONS

13. Parties with articles for sale will be allowed on the grounds after meeting with the Committee in charge. A contract must be signed and the agreed price paid in full, prior to admission to the grounds. **NOTICE** is hereby given that the Officers of the Paris Fair reserve all rights to the grounds and may restrict or prohibit admittance to the grounds, or within 300 yards thereof, to any person or group of persons without giving any reason for this action.

14. **PARKING ON THE GROUNDS;** vehicles must be parked where instructed by the committee in charge. The Society is not responsible for damage and/or loss of property.

PRIZES

15. **WORTHY EXHIBITS** - Judges are instructed to award prizes to worthy exhibits. It is the intention of the Paris Fair to give no distinction or premium of any kind to an article that is not deserving of such awards.

16. **JUNIOR PRIZE MONEY** will be paid out at Fair Office from 1 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 3rd 2011 until the Fair closes. Exhibitor or parent must sign for prizes. All premiums not taken up by December 31 2011 shall be forfeited to the Society.

17. **PRIZE MONEY** of \$5.00 or over will be mailed in October 2010. Please call 442-2823 if prize money not received by November 15th /11. All premiums not taken up by December 31, 2011 shall be forfeited to the Society. **ALL PRIZES** at this fair if not competed for, shall become the property of the Society.

18. **IN CASE OF Insufficient funds due to weather or other conditions,** the Society reserves the right to pay only a percentage of the prizes awarded for exhibits.

POWERS OF THE SOCIETY

19. The interpretation of Rules and Regulations are made by the Managing Committee of the Paris Agricultural Society, and their decision will be final. In case of a printing error in the prize list the Society will have the final decision.

HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

20. Upon making an entry or display, the Exhibitor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Paris Agricultural Society, their members, agents and employees from and against all claims, demands, losses, costs, damages, actions, suits or proceedings by any third parties that may arise out of, or may attribute to, all operations performed by or carried out by the Exhibitor, his agents, employees, or anyone for whose acts he may be held liable, howsoever caused.

Exhibitors must pay a \$10.00 Exhibitor fee to the Paris Agricultural Society

Entry Fees – All Classes – \$1.00 each. NO REFUNDS

All poultry and pet stock must be in the Poultry Buildings Friday, Sept. 2nd between 3 – 10 p.m. Judging to commence at 9 a.m. Saturday September 3rd

All exhibits must remain cooped until 6 p.m. Monday September 5th

Coops will be provided for all exhibits except all waterfowl. The committee reserves the right to double coop if necessary. Previous show awards not to be displayed. Birds will be cared for and fed by the show committee.

Fair board not responsible for loss of birds.

Thank you to Eric Reeker Livestock Feeds, Caledonia for donating feed to Poultry Show.

At time of judging no one is allowed in the building except the judges and the committee.

Champions will be picked from all birds.

In Sections of Classes where there are not two or more exhibits, the Judge shall be empowered to award a second, a third or no prize, where he considers the exhibit does not merit a first prize.

Poultry showing symptoms of disease will be excluded from the exhibition, strictly enforced.

Pigeon Exhibitors are requested to write Ring Band No. on their coop tags.

Note: All birds entered must originate from Salmonella Pullorum-Typhoid clean provinces, states, countries, or have been tested (to Animal disease and Protection Act-Section 79, standards) with negative results to be eligible for entry.

GENERAL RULES OF PARIS FAIR RE: CATTLE

All cattle must be on the grounds **by 10:00 a.m. and remain until 4:30 p.m.** Exhibitors leaving before this time without permission will forfeit their prize money. All exhibitors must pay an exhibitor fee of \$10.00. General rules of the Agricultural Society to govern. Entry fee will be 20 percent of prize money won. Exhibitors must be ready to exhibit their animals when called.

All cattle **TRUCKS** must be removed from the grounds as soon as unloaded and parked in the areas designated for this purpose.

ENTRIES:

Definition of an Entry – All registered Cattle, whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly) which are maintained on one farm or breeding unit, are considered to be the production of one farm or breeding unit.

No cow will be allowed to compete for premiums unless giving milk when shown, or visibly in calf at the time. Female cattle under three years old, giving milk, may be shown as cows in the herd or group sections.

All purebred animals must be registered and pedigrees must be produced at the Fair when requested by the Directors in charge.

Junior calves exempt from this rule demanding pedigrees.

All entries must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor.

The Show Veterinarian has the final say on the health of the livestock exhibited.

IMPORTANT: “Providing there are three or more exhibitors who exhibit at least 24 animals the prize schedule for each section listed with each breed of cattle will be paid, otherwise only 50 percent of this amount will be paid”.

Straw only for bedding (not supplied) – no sawdust
Place Manure in Proper Area
Bring Wheelbarrow or Something

CODE OF ETHICS FOR DAIRY SHOWS:

While presenting a positive image to spectators, the following supports good animal husbandry both at home and at a show.

PART 1

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as unethical in the show ring of registered dairy cattle.

1. misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
2. filling an animal unnaturally with liquid (tubing)
3. balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
4. treating the udder, internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation.
5. administering epidural anesthesia (blocking tails)

6. performing surgery of any kind to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
7. inserting foreign material/articles under the skin, into the topline or on the feet.
8. roping udders.
9. criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or show.

PART 2

The provisions of this part apply to entries of a breed regulated by a breed association which has adopted this part.

1. if intended for use in contravention of the Code of Ethics, no exhibitor and no agent, employee or other person acting on behalf of an exhibitor, shall have in his or her possession or control any hypodermic syringe, needle or other device, swabs, cloths, or other material, or any medicine, preparation or substance, whether in liquid or any other form.
2. Exhibitors will not be allowed to wrap hocks or drain fluid from hocks at a show unless authorized by a veterinarian at the show.
3. all entries and the personal property of all exhibitors, their servants and agents and persons acting on behalf of exhibitors, are subject to inspection by inspectors authorized by a show. All such persons shall co-operate with the inspectors and shall provide all such information in connection with such inspections and shall provide access to the animal and all information reasonably required by inspectors in connection with such inspections and shall provide, if so requested, samples of urine and blood suitable for analysis. Exhibitors shall also remove any udder supports, blankets or other objects limiting the ability of the inspector to undertake a thorough inspection. In particular, the inspectors shall be informed, in advance, of the nature of any medicine, treatment or substance administered to any entry and the reasons therefore. Inspections under this paragraph may be carried out at any time while the animal is at the show and elsewhere in the period ending 30 days after the termination of the show between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
4. Any inspector may, at any time, require the delivery to him of any hypodermic syringe, needle or other device, swabs, cloths or other material, or samples or any medicine, preparation or substance, whether in liquid or other form, in the possession or control of the exhibitor, his servants, agents or persons acting on behalf of the exhibitor for the purposes of laboratory analysis.
5. (A) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (b) the following entries are disqualified and shall not participate further in the show in which the entry is disqualified.
 - (i) Any animal determined by an inspector, who is also a veterinarian, to have an udder manifesting any of the following: localized swelling, oedema, erythema, sensitivity, reddening, firmness, warmth or exfoliation of the skin, but excluding general oedema associated with parturition or mastitis, or a sore in the area where the large blood vessels enter the udder.
 - (ii) Any animal entered by an exhibitor whose servants, agents or persons acting on his behalf, fails to co-operate in the inspection provided for under paragraphs 3 or 4.
 (B) The inspector's determination pursuant to subparagraph (A) (i) is subject to an appeal by the exhibitor to the appeal committee appointed by the show for the purpose. Any such appeal must be made by notice in writing delivered to the show management within 1 hour of notification of the inspector's determination.

In keeping with the basic philosophy of the fair/exhibition show committee, ethics are an individual responsibility. However, it should be understood that violators are subject to disciplinary provisions of the Rules and Regulations.
